Keep flashlights and battery operated radio on hand.

Avoid opening refrigerator or freezer doors to keep food fresh longer.

If you use a portable generator, operate it outside, never indoors.

Your generator should be directly connected to lights and appliances.

In the winter, wear layers of dry clothes.

If you use a kerosene heater be sure to provide adequate ventilation.

If you have municipal water, let water trickle from faucets to avoid frozen pipes. Never thaw pipes with a torch.

During an emergency, please do not tie up emergency personnel and phone lines with general questions.

Emergency information will be released to the media.

You may also receive information from an automated calling system that contacts your home.

an Emergency

Follow these simple safety tips, to help us help you in an Emergency.

During any emergency, the most important thing you can do is stay informed.

Listen for emergency broadcasts and to local media outlets for public safety instructions and information.

Public shelter locations & emergency evacuation routes will be broadcast through local media outlets.

A community-wide emergency is any event that presents an immediate threat to you, your neighbors and your surroundings.

This could involve severe weather, a natural disaster, an industrial hazard or a national security concern.

Prepare a Disaster Supply Kit in Advance

1. Flashlight with extra batteries.
2. At least 1 gallon of water for each person per day (3-day supply)
3. 3-day supply of non-perishable food per person.
4. Battery-powered or hand crank radio with extra batteries.
5. A few days worth of necessary prescription medications.
6. A first aid kit.
7. Extra blankets and sleeping bags.
8. One complete change of clothing per person.
9. Infant food, formula, bottles, diapers, and medicine.
10. Manual can opener, utensils, paper plates and cups.
