


# Q1 How important are parks, recreation, and open space to the quality of life in Corning?





# Q5 What is your impression of the condition and cleanliness of each Corning City Park?







## Q11 In general, how aware are you of the Corning City Parks and their amenities?



It needs to have flowers, bird baths, fountains, butterfly gardens. There is so much potential here to be something really beautiful. Some lighting would be nice for evening strolls. o Mowing – looks a bit overgrown – not neat and tidy – not inviting. o Parking – street parking only o Bathrooms – no facilities, a porta-potty would be nice. o Pavement Benches/Seating – limited benches – needs to be updated. o Paths/Paved Walkways – cinder pathways Civic Center Plaza o General Appearance – it looks abandoned and cold. It wouldn't take much to have colorful umbrellas over tables and flowers pots. o Mowing – N/A but the landscaping is lacking and could really use some beautiful flowers to fill the plaza. o Equipment – lacking in some charming seating areas. o Pavilions – N/A but some covered seating would be nice – the courtyard does get warm. o Parking – the parking can be difficult at the library and city offices. Not very friendly with small children. o Bathrooms – a must in this area. If the library isn't open there is no option available. o Pavement/Brickwork – this could use some attention to prevent tripping o Benches/Seating – more could be provided to encourage people to use the area - more family friendly. I have a ton of ideas for this area to make it useable for children and adults. Denison o General Appearance – There are times when the park looks well maintain and other times it is a mess – with overgrown grass, downed trees and branches, no flowers, dirty pavilions, scum filled pond. o Mowing – the grass is often left to become overgrown and when moved heavy grass is left all over the fields and open areas. o Equipment – the equipment is very outdated and in disrepair. Many of the pieces have items missing, dirty, and broken. The play areas are weed filled. The mats for the some of the toys are not in their intended place. The little ring road for biking needs repair to asphalt. The swing for special needs is wonderful but more adult sized swings could be used to accommodate larger individuals. A shared parent/child swing would be wonderful! o Pavilions – the newer pavilion is nice – a light would be nice for evening use. That side of the park gets dark fast with the dike and roadway blocking the evening sun. The older pavilion could also use a light. This pavilion could use a weekly power wash to stay tidy. o Bathrooms – the bathrooms are clean. The biggest issue is that they need to be open longer or even all year long. We frequent the park all year and having a bathroom especially for children is a must. Additional water fountains around the park would be nice. o Out Buildings – covered with graffiti – has been left there for a couple of years. The buildings are underutilized. It would be great to offer some snacks or beverages at certain times in the summer. o Pavement/Parking – additional parking could really be used. People often have to park in the grass which leads to big holes. The drainage by the bathrooms after a hard rain needs to be addressed. I hope that plans to do the last stretch on the backside of the pond are in the plans. o Benches/Seating – around the playground area there could be additional and what is currently there is not in good shape. Picnic benches are old and dirty. o Paths/Paved Walkways o Athletic Fields – seemed to be tended well, although mowing is inconsistent excess grass is an issue – long rows of grass are often the norm. o Ponds – the ponds are filled with green algae, downed trees, and weeds are starting to overtake the pond area. The Gazebo is nice. There could be additional seating around the pond for fishing. o Pool – nice new chairs this year. Have not been in the dressing areas recently. It would be nice if the pool season was longer. o Skate Park – doesn't seem sufficient in its design. o Tunnels – graffiti at times o Trees – I was in the park when a massive branch broke off of a tree only 150 yards from our family. The branch just missed a vehicle and completely covered the roadway. I called 911 and reported the incident. A city crew came about 15 minutes later. Many of the trees seem to be in bad condition. Over the past two years several willow trees have fallen into the pond. Many branches still remain in the pond and are an eyesore. Even when trees have been cut down they have been left for weeks before being cleaned up. Those in the pond are going on a couple of years. o Tennis Courts/ Basketball Courts – they are in decent condition and are frequently used. o Workout Stations – a very nice addition to the park. I see that they are used quite often when I pass through. o Volley Ball – sand could be filled in and cleaned. o Horseshoe Area – adequate for the amount of use it gets. o Frisbee Golf – nice set up for this. I feel bad for those who are golfing when the grass is not mowed properly – wet and messy. Hillvue o General Appearance – there are parts that are nicely kept and other not so much. We like to use this park in the spring before the weeds have taken over the play area. o Mowing – nice by the lookout but the others areas are inconsistent in the timely mowing allowing grass to get too long. The weeds in the play area are bad. I have noticed a neighborhood lady taking the time to weed the playground area. o Equipment – the equipment is not bad but could use a good power wash every season. o Pavilions – the area is clean. Picnic table could use a regular cleaning. Plants growing on the roof. Look-out pavilion is kept nice. o Parking – street parking only. Amount of parking is not an issue. o Bathrooms – they are locked and never open. This is not acceptable with small children using the area and families picnicking. Water fountain not working. What do you do when you have small children? I have had to keep a small potty in our car just because parks don't have facilities for them to use. I hate to say it but we have had to go behind a tree because it was an emergency situation. o Out Buildings – need repair. Bathrooms out of order. o Benches/Seating - adequate o Paths/Paved Walkways - I am not sure if the bike path is part of the park. This is nice but the grass isn't mowed all the way to the ends. If you bike through the area you get weed whipped by the long grass. I am an avid biker and would love to see the path extended all the way down the dike to Denison Park. That would be such a nice ride for families. Williams Street Park and Denison could be the anchors for this. It would be a nice selling point for the city to encourage people to come and bike the path and visit the downtown. Houghton o General Appearance – this park has the nicest/most updated equipment of all the parks. This park is very neat looking and kept tidy. o Mowing – grass is allowed to get too long in-between mowing – long rows of cut grass left causing it to be unsightly and difficult to play sports on or walk through. o Equipment – the nicest equipment in all of the parks. One of the slides has too big of a drop-off at the end of it – very dangerous for little ones. o Pavilions – small but nice for the area. o Parking – plenty of street parking around the park. o Bathrooms – has a portable unit, which every park should have if there isn't a permanent facility. o Benches/Seating – newer than other parks. McKinney o General Appearance – this park has many of the same issues as Dennison Park. I think this park was last updated at the same time. As you consider developing a strategy, I would ask you to think forward and use people's experiences as a foundation but move towards the newest technology and even take some risk in predicting what the community needs in the future, not what they need today. While thinking of the community needs, I also ask that city deliver to the needs of the whole community, which is difficult due to the bimodal wealth distribution of the community. Corning is a small town far from metropolitan areas, but is in the middle of a huge population that is a drivable distance away. With cities like Pittsburgh, Cleveland, Toronto, Buffalo, Syracuse, Boston, New York, Philadelphia and Washington DC within a 7 hour drive Corning could become a meeting place for highly competitive athletic matches. It is my opinion that the success of the Wine Glass marathon is not due to the organization that put it on, though their effort should not be disregarded, it is due to the ability to draw people for a quick weekend trip from many places. As an active parent in the AAU basketball circuit, ultra high competition matches could be easily organized to draw teams from the previously marked metros. Corning could be the place for the big teams to meet. Similar arguments could be made for swimming, lacrosse, hockey, soccer, wrestling, baseball/softball, track and field and artistic performances. The Arts At Canfield The geographic slope at Canfield park makes the park almost unusable as a place for recreational play - but is ideally setup for an amphitheater. I would like the community to support the development of a place where people can come together around a stage that compliments the smaller stage setting on Market Street. The park could be a simple structure with a covered stage with open seating or a three season covered arena protecting audiences from the elements. Modern facilities with water and electricity is a necessity along with points of sale for concessions including alcoholic beverages. The sales (either contracted or run by the city itself) could support some of the costs of maintaining the facility. Fields At Stewart There is a need for field space for lacrosse and soccer. Local club teams within the community currently use Stewart along with other parks. I would dedicate a park specifically for field space and provide modern facilities (bathrooms, concession stands). Collaboration With the CPP The city stadium has been essentially been given to CPP, however CPP has failed to deliver on promises that have been made to the community. With promises to open their facilities to the community during the upgrades, the community has not been provided access. The community has also been restricted from using the track in their own stadium for recreational running. Better agreements should be made to share facilities including CPP tennis courts, volleyball, baseball fields, gym space and indoor track for the use of the stadium and future facilities. The Facility At Dennison The most ambitious and needed facility for Corning is the indoor facility. I think the best location would be where the swimming pool and fields are at Denison Park today. I would strongly encourage the city to go big to create an athletic tourism destination for Corning. To start, an olympic size pool and diving center would be unique enough to bring in the best talent from the cities. The pool facility could also be shared by CPP. 


