DOG LICENSE AND CONCERNS

City Residents Only

How much does it cost?

- Annual Fees: Unaltered - \$15.50; Spayed or Neutered - \$7.50.

How can I pay for it?

Who do I contact with concerns?

Routine concerns such as the leash law, barking, lost or found dogs, or other concerns can be made by calling the

- Corning Police at (607) 962-0340 ext. 1500.

Does my dog have to be licensed?

- You will need to provide a current rabies certificate and proof of spayed/neutered via a veterinarian’s Certificate.
- New York State Law requires that dogs be licensed by the age of 4 months.
- New York State Agriculture and Markets Law requires all dogs be immunized against rabies.

Does Corning have a leash law?

- No dog shall be permitted to run a large within the City of Corning.
- No dog shall be permitted upon the public streets or upon any public property within the City of Corning unless it is accompanied by an adult or by a minor who is able to restrain and control the dog and unless such person accompanying the dog shall actually control and restrain the dog by a leash not exceeding eight feet in length.

Is there a noisy dog ordinance?

- It is unlawful to keep any dog within the corporate limits of the City that by barking, howling or making any other noise, causes any disturbance or creates any nuisance.

What is the pooper scooper law for Corning?

- It shall be the duty of the dog owner, or person in charge of the dog, to remove any waste left by such dog on any sidewalk, street or other public property of the City of Corning or on the private property of another person.

A word about rabies.

Rabies is a potentially fatal disease that affects all mammals. The virus is passed in the saliva of an infected animal. There is no cure once an unvaccinated human or mammal becomes symptomatic. Symptoms of an animal with rabies may include drooling, varying degrees of paralysis, uncharacteristic vocalization and aversion to water. The animal may act unusually furious or friendly.

Your local veterinarian can provide the rabies vaccinations. Additionally, the Steuben County Public Health Office provides free rabies clinics at various times and locations. Call the public health office at (607) 664-2438 for more information.
