Q1 If the basketball and tennis courts in the park system were refurbished, how often would you use them?



Q2 Would you like the City to keep any baseball or softball fields within the Parks System?



Q3 Are you in favor of a dog park (as proposed in the Draft Report, with safety, maintenance, and noise considerations addressed) in the City of Corning?





Q5 Are you in favor of a tobacco and vaping ban within the parks system?










Meeting Summary

The City of Corning is working with Barton & Loguidice (B&L) to develop a City-wide strategy that balances the economic, social, historical, and environmental amenities of the community's **parks system**. Along with the community recreation survey that has been active since March, this open house was one of the primary opportunities for gathering public input. An estimated **80-90 community members** attended this event, providing ideas, comments, and feedback.

For the first 15 minutes of the meeting, members of B&L staff gave a presentation outlining the **purpose, progress, and next steps** of the parks strategy. For the next 15 minutes, Corning City Manager Mark Ryckman presented preliminary **low-cost ideas** for the parks system that were developed in conversation with other City Staff. For the remaining two hours, community members provided feedback by placing stickers eight **preference boards**, writing comments on cards and posters, and discussing ideas with B&L and Corning City staff.

Overall, the open house generated a wealth of valuable information, and clearly showed the amount of **passion** that the citizens of Corning have for their parks system. The following pages outline the **quantitative and qualitative feedback** that was gathered throughout the evening. Please note that the comments written on each page of this report have been transcribed directly, and have been chosen as representative samples of the feedback that was received. For a full list of sorted comments, please refer to Appendix B: Inventory of Comments. Please also note that the results in this document only include information gathered from those who attended this Open House; additional information has been gathered through stakeholder focus groups, a parks preference survey, and other means of outreach.



- Nearly **75%** of attendees were in **favor** of creating a dog park in the parks system through a non-profit organization, with several attendees stressing the importance of a centrally-located facility.
- Those who were not in favor of a dog park mentioned **concerns** with noise in residential areas, potential dog attacks, and a lack of maintenance.
- **William St. Park** was identified as the best potential site for a dog park, while Denison Park and McKinney Park were also mentioned. Several attendees specifically mentioned that Houghton Park would not work well for a dog park considering the amount of activity that occurs near the park.
- Of those who expressed interest in a dog park, many were in favor of **separated play areas for large and small dogs**. Other amenities, such as a dog washing station or social spaces for owners, received some support.
- Of those who answered, nearly 85% were willing to pay a small annual **maintenance fee**.

PROJECT TIMELINE



- Dog Park
 - We could use a dog park in the city - however it must be maintained (not self-maintained since you can expect it)
 - My grandpa has three dogs No Dog Park
 - I think the city can support more than one dog park - I would recommend one on the North Side, and one on the South Side. A possible 3rd location would be Denison Park on the east side. I would suggest McKinney Park on the Southside; William St. on the Northside.
 - No dog parks
 - No dog park at Houghton Park. Too busy during school year, too much traffic, area is used by many students, children, and families (practices, playing, hanging out), area is busy during DMV Driving tests
 - I'm not interested in a dog park
 - No dog park
 - I don't have any interest in a dirty dog park!
- Parks Strategy Appreciation
 - It was a great presentation. We really need people looking into the parks. I am willing to help to make this possible
 - Improvements are necessary to keep people of Corning engaged in City Parks
 - I really enjoyed the City Manager's low cost ideas
 - Many of Mr. Ryckman's ideas were very innovative and practical
 - We appreciate you asking for our voice
 - I support Mr. Ryckman's ideas
- Sports Courts & Fields
 - McKinney Park has a baseball diamond
 - I would like to see lacrosse goals and a ball wall that could be used for soccer and lacrosse
 - Interested in outdoor box lacrosse field
 - McKinney Park, and its woods, may be a great place for a smaller, 9 hole disc golf course intended more for youth, recreational play.
 - We hope someday to have enough private and public disc golf courses in the Greater Corning Area to host a large, economically relevant, mega-tournament.
 - Likewise, please maintain existing facilities (e.g. basketball and tennis courts) rather than tearing them down for something else. Their poor condition minimizes their use.
 - Basketball court is the most used part of McKinney Park
 - A court for badminton would be used
- Pools and Aquatic Facilities:
 - I propose closing a pool completely and adding a splash zone at the open pool to reduce overhead.
 - Please keep both pools open and add a splash pad
 - Please do not put in a splash pool to replace Denison Park pool - only small children would use it compared to the children of all ages using the pool. This will be worth the money

- Would it be possible/feasible to add a splash pad without removing a pool?
- My family and I live at Stewart Park Apartments. All in favor of fixing the Stewart Park pool. Low income children need a safe place to play, learn to swim, and socialize in the summer. Thank you.
- Denison Park Pool was too crowded this summer with Stewart Park Pool being closed. Keep both pools open and update Hillvue Park sprinklers.
- Idea: keep both pools open and add a splash park.
- Parks System Overview
 - Denison:
 - Denison Park smells very bad. It makes it difficult to use the facilities. I would not upgrade park until that problem is resolved.
 - The pond at Denison Park is in desperate need of irrigation or treatment, along with a more viable solution for circulating the water to prevent stagnation
 - Fix Denison Park smell from the sewer plant - please!
 - Houghton:
 - Please be respectful of City Parks that are within residential neighborhoods. For instance, Houghton Park is already too close to school traffic and the driving test.
 - Stewart
 - Stewart Park desperately needs to remove the unsafe and dangerous old tennis court. Our kids ride bikes in there and the rusty, broken fences are hazards. Please give us a safe place for the kids to play! I've lived at Stewart Park Apts. - right behind this park - for 15 years. My family and I are ashamed of the way this tennis court with its non-working tall lights makes us and our low-income community look like a ghetto. We are not.
 - Walker Park
 - Walker Park would be a great place for a nature garden/artpark.
 - Please do not spend any money on Walker Park - it is a median with no parking available. A bench of piece of art - maybe.
 - Achsinnessink Memorial
 - Park is out of the way and not a great place to do much except maybe art
 - Civic Center Plaza
 - Use it!
- Parks System Improvements
 - Restrooms
 - Please keep the bathrooms open, even if at designated hours (x3)
 - Parking
 - Add 6-8 parking spots along Sims Ave in Houghton Park
 - Houghton Park needs parking or curbing to discourage parking on the grass
 - Playgrounds
 - Also, we need proper swings at Stewart Park. All the current swings are for toddlers except for one, and that one is actually too tall.
 - Robotics team is looking to develop a handicap-accessible swing
 - More woodchips in playground or rubber mulch

Inventory of Comments

- Adaptive Playgrounds should be explored
- Pavilions:
 - Install electric hook-ups in pavilions (x4)
 - Please install netting on the pavilions so birds stay out! Was at a picnic and birds pooped on a woman's head.
- Seating
 - More park benches everywhere!
 - Benches should be installed at all parks
 - Porch swings or swings for adults
- Winter Activities
 - More activities from fall to spring, such as heated paths and a sledding hill
 - Winter sports and ski trails
- Maintenance/Cleaning
 - Trash pickup can be an issue in Denison Park in the summer.
 - Have high-quality facilities - if you have it, it should be maintained. Eliminate all non-maintained facilities, basketball, tennis, fields
 - Please make sure that adequate funding will always exist to maintain new developments. Consider posting the maintenance schedule on your site.
 - Removal of beer bottles in Canfield Park
- Accessibility
 - More/additional ADA equipment like the swing at Denison Park
- Pocket Parks
 - Not in favor of mini parks unless other main park improvements are made first
 - Please minimize micro-parks idea unless the cost maintain them is minimal
- Specific Improvements
 - Exercise-Related
 - Install exercise stations in Houghton Park
 - Ninja Warrior workout course (x3)
 - Lighting
 - Add and repair lighting behind fire department and under brisco bridge
 - Skate Park
 - Please make sure that the poorly designed, original skate park in Denison is replaced by a good skate park that has sufficient funding/resources to maintain it
 - Start by improving skate parks in Denison. Then add another state of the art park every 5 years or so, until you have 3-4 skate parks. It could be a real draw, and the foundation for a regional skating event. Especially for Stewart Park as there are many low-income children that need a place to skate.
 - Expanded or additional skate park
 - Music:
 - Install a music venue with food trucks, or bring your own picnic, in Denison Park
 - Flight Center
 - A flight center would work well at McKinney as well as Stewart. People already fly kites, rockets, and drones there.

- ❑ Wildlife Habitat:
 - Bat houses everywhere are a must!
- ❑ Sustainable Landscaping
 - More trees especially along the cherry blossom walk, butterfly attracting gardens would all be ideal for the spaces in McKinney Park that are not part of the sports fields or courts.
- ❑ Kids Bike Park
 - Please keep tennis courts in McKinney as bike park as it is already used for teaching kids to ride bikes.
- ❑ Children's Trail/Library
 - Combine children's trail, outdoor library, and music park, and use talking is teaching campaign playground and United Way Born Learning trail components. The United Way is willing to partner (Southern Tier Kids on Track). Also partner with library, and Pro Action Family Literacy
 - Implementation of kid-friendly attraction (it used to be kid-friendly 15 years ago) in Canfield Park
 - Fun-looking bookshelves for kids
- ❑ Cherry Blossom/Trees
 - Replace dead trees with flowering trees in McKinney
 - Tree Removal: trees that are removed need to be replaced
 -
- ❑ Adventure:
 - Put in BMX Course in parks
 - Outdoor obstacle course (rock wall, balance beam, etc.)
 - Put in obstacle course in parks
- ❑ Boating:
 - Clean out Denison Park water for canoes/kayaks
- ❑ Birding
 - River-side events and educational opportunities (e.g. birding)
- ❑ Dancing
 - Large group dancing with music in the parks (Family Dance in the Park)
- ❑ Indoor Recreation Center
 - Civic recreation facility with indoor basketball courts, work-out facility, swimming pool. Free to residents, pay to non-Corning people.
 - City RecCenter with Basketball courts, meeting rooms, workout center, and other facilities (pool, ice rink, after school programs, camps, leagues)
- Connectivity & Accessibility
 - ❑ Add sidewalk along dyke behind Fire Department
 - ❑ Connected trails for the whole city is an excellent idea. We have an 11-year-old middle-schooler who could benefit from a safe place to ride across the city that doesn't have traffic concerns.
 - ❑ Bike share, though, I believe is not for Corning. We are too small a city to sustain this.

Inventory of Comments

- ❑ The flood control property along the River (7 miles long from Building Company to Hodgeton Creek) would make an ideal walking/running/biking and cross country skiing path. The city owns the land and the path is already there (no need to buy or build anything - just cut the grass along the chosen path and you have a great path). Please do not ignore this wonderful scenario.
- ❑ Use the flood control land along the river for a primitive path (walking, running, biking, cross country skiing). The land is publicly owned and the path is already there (x3)

- Potential demand for adult league as graduates get older
 - WNY Men's league is well-established
 - Potential creation of rookie rugby league
 - 6 week league begins next spring
 - 7 on 7, like flag football
 - (501)(c)(3)
 - Current Use
 - Stewart Park for practice
 - Gang Mills or East Campbell for home games
 - Used March-June 5 days/week
 - Size Requirements
 - 70 yds. X 120 yds.
 - Issues
 - Full length field does not currently exist in Corning
 - Poor quality of grass in Stewart Park
 - Mound creates tripping hazard
 - Lack of restrooms or porta-potties
 - Currently have to pay for porta-potty at Stewart
 - Opportunities
 - Full length field could be constructed in Stewart Park by removing the backstops and mound
 - Improved bathroom facilities at Stewart Park
 - Senior game at CCC got good attendance

 - Small team, and potential loss of homeschoolers with new vaccination law
 - Play at Denison Park, and never had issues reserving field space

 - \$2,000+ yearly from Dues
 - \$1500 yearly from Ice Bowl
 - Looking for ways to resolve crossing fairways
 - \$6000 in Parks Foundation Account; \$2000 in Checking Account
 - Background
 - Feedback from many users that they feel safer in the park with more people using the disc golf course.

- Established 1994 (25th anniversary)
 - Also fastest-growing sport in USA
- Demographics
 - 50 dues-paying members
 - Leagues Sunday AM & Wednesday PM
 - Many kids and families often tag along
- Current Use
 - Denison Park Disc Golf Course
 - Otherwise, nearest is Bath KOA
- Issues
 - Conflicts with other users at Denison Park
 - Crossing fairways at Denison Park
- Opportunities
 - Funding available to redesign/add new course
 - Continue planting trees & maintaining course
 - Wooded areas can be desirable for disk golf, which brings all the ecological and sustainability benefits of enhanced tree canopy.
 - Disk golf can be played year-round, and offers alternative outdoor activity during winter months.
- Other Observations
 - Backstop in Denison only seen used 1 time in years
 - Tennis Courts in Denison are rarely used

- Accessing the Water
 - Potential boat launch discussed as potential method for connecting with the River
 - Improved Cohocton St. Boat Launch
 - Formalized Wegmans Boat Launch
 - Explore opportunities for financing (Wegmans?)
 - DEC expressed favorable opinion of boat launches
 - Economic & Quality of Life Impact
 - Provides tourism & economic benefits
 - Encourages residents to stay in Corning on weekends
 - Friends of the Chemung River expressed interest in helping to secure funding and designs for improved and formalized boat launches
 - Potential outreach to Corning, Inc.
 - Importance of keeping launches ADA accessible
- Running Trails
 - Mentioned Cleveland's Emerald Necklace as model system

- Opportunities to cycle, run, ski, walk through parks system
 - Southern Tier Running Club
 - Over 300 members and quickly growing
 - Typically use Finger Lakes Trail & regional trail network
 - Expressed sincere support for connecting parks and stated that they club would frequently use any multi-use trails
 - DOT discussion of TAP Funding
 - 2018: Over 140 million dollars granted to NYS Communities
 - Needs to have clear connectivity between two points
 - Could work in collaboration with Safe Routes to School
 - Can work in conjunction with non-profits
 - Eligible for LWRP Funding & implementation
 - Examples of Previous Projects
 - Shama Trail in Hornell (stone dust)
 - Keuka & Hammondsport Proposed Trail
 - Proposed to connect school to waterfront
 - Rejected, but 'good-looking application'
- River-side Trail
 - Opportunities
 - Potential connection to Steuben County trails system
 - Create a series of wayfinding points
 - Public support has long been strong
 - Considerations
 - 2009 STC Project ran into issues with regulatory measures
 - DEC protects life and property through flood control structure
 - Proposed maintenance plan is key for applications
 - Open to idea of path, but needs to be a formalized process
 - Regulations p. 501
 - Permitting must be alongside consideration of a notification system, parking issues, and structural analysis/documents
 - Purpose of Flood Control Structure
 - Considered DEC property, even if on top of private land
 - Built in 1940s
 - Enables 80% of any damage to be covered by Corps of Engineers, instead of 0%
 - Inspected yearly, with video inspections every 5 years

- Worries of liability & keeping citizens out during dangerous times
 - Friends of the Chemung River expressed a willingness to discuss previous successes with similar projects between Big Flats and Elmira
 - Gates could be constructed to reduce access
- Maintenance Considerations
 - Many programs provide start-up funds, but very few address on-going maintenance
 - Gaffer District manages maintenance of Centerway Bridge
 - Looking for potential stakeholders & partnerships
 - Pitch idea of community members as stakeholders
 - Rotary expressed willingness to collaborate with maintenance, but needs an entity to work directly with government
 - Scouts of America
 - Eagle Projects can involve anything not using power tools
 - Expressed interest in working on maintenance of trails
- Wayfinding Discussion
 - Nearly all stakeholders recognized a need for improved wayfinding between parks
 - Suggestion for allowing businesses to 'adopt a trail'
 - Suggestion for every park to include map of entire park system
- Other comments
 - Potential use of trails by equestrian groups to connect to Wellsburg
 - Economic benefits of establishing river access include drawing tourists into Corning, and encouraging residents to stay in Corning rather than travel to another community for river recreation ("Staycation")

- Introduction to Maintenance Issues
 - Alex Hamilton (City of Corning Parks & Recreation Director)

- Outlined cost of upkeep
 - Detailed ongoing issues at Stewart Pool
 - “Band-Aid” repairs for years caught up with pool
 - In-House repairs are taking longer than expected, leading pool to be closed for the entirety of the summer
 - Potential investigation into contaminated dirt that may cause concrete to crack and settle improperly
 - Discussion of 2017 B&L Facilities Report
 - Recommended closing both pools and implementing splash pads
 - Potential opening of Lap Pool at Denison Park
 - Splash pads are far cheaper both to build and to maintain
- Current Use of Pools
 - Kids Adventure Club (Pathways)
 - Use pools on daily basis during summer
 - Typically use Denison Park Pool
 - Typically 5-12 year olds
 - 80-90 children per day (50 go to pool)
 - Group pays for children
 - Corning Youth Group (Family Service Center)
 - Walk to Stewart Park Pool when open
 - Go every Wednesday
 - 25 children/day
 - 8-18 years old
 - Pool day is biggest attraction
 - Group pays for children
 - Amy's Sunshine Program
 - 16 children (up to 100 at times)
 - Go to pool 4-5 times per week
 - Typically use pools for lessons
- Current Issues with Pools
 - Denison Pool lacks facilities for 5-8 year olds
 - No transition area between the wading pool and the deep end
 - Creates difficult situation for children to learn how to swim
 - Transportation Issues with Stewart Park Closure
 - Bus ride to Denison Park costs up to \$200/day
 - Is currently covered by grant money
 - Discussion of Other Nearby Pools

- School Pool: potential use during summer off-season
 - YMCA: Currently having a great year for pool usage
 - Watson Homestead Pool
 - Craig Park Pool (Painted Post)
- Potential Consideration of Splash Pads
 - All group members emphasized importance of keeping as many pools open as possible
 - Learning to swim is an essential tool for life
 - Issues with water quality in nearby water bodies make pools an increasingly valued resource
 - Pools are one of the best ways to ensure that kids get outside
 - Particularly in Corning, which is perceived to not have enough activities geared towards teens
 - Worries of creating a 'recreation desert' for lower-income children who cannot afford to use the YMCA or private pools
 - Potential Closing of One Pool
 - If a pool must be closed, securing transportation to the active pool is paramount
 - Addresses social equity component of parks systems
 - Potential direct summer route between parks
 - Potential swim/bus combined ticket at reduced rate?
 - Identifying a potential funding source is key
 - Issues with Splash Pads
 - Worries of supervision of younger children
 - Difficulties with line of sight and supervision guidelines
 - Worries of potential injuries due to surface
 - Discussion of potential renting of splash pads to reduce conflicts over space
 - Worries of attendance
 - Will as many children show up for splash pad days as currently do for pool days?
 - Splash pads are more geared towards younger children, while pools serve a more diverse age range

 - Potential re-opening of Hillvue Park Sprinkler System

Topics of Discussion

- Addressing Potential Concerns of Dog Parks
 - Noise
 - Generally dog parks are not very noisy, but locating away from houses is better
 - Safety
 - Measures can be enacted to ensure that dogs and owners are safe
 - Maintenance
 - Many dog parks do become self-policing
 - Importance of creating a small maintenance fund
 - Install bag stations
 - Larger dog parks prove easier to maintain
 - Vaccinations
 - Owners have to present proof of dog's vaccination in order to receive permit
 - Potential day passes for hotel guests with proof of vaccinations
- Overview of City of Corning's Interest in Dog Park
 - City willing to designate space, but will not use city staff to maintain the park
 - Non-profit (501)(c)(3) organization could be founded to organize, maintain, and spread awareness of dog park
 - Described as a 'viable' option
 - Many members of the public expressed a willingness to spend \$25/year to become 'members' of the dog park
 - Funding could be secured through grants
 - Potentially name park after Amo Houghton, a well-known Bassett Hound
- Overview of Amenities
 - While thinking about amenities is important, establishing the dog park is the first hurdle to jump over
 - Social spaces for owners provide an important 'third space' for public interaction
 - Dog washing station would be nice
 - Small and large dog designated areas are important for safety
 - Double-gated entrance is key for ensuring that dogs cannot get out
- Overview of Past Dog-Related Issues

- Canfield Park incident with off-leash pitbulls
- Generally lack of issues with dogs in city
- Potential Locations
 - Denison Park does not make sense for dog park
 - Already has enough amenities and is crowded
 - William St. Park is a great location
 - Has been evaluated for a dog park previously in 2004
 - Thought that legitimate users can drive away unwanted activity in back area of park
 - In order to remove the basketball court, it must go through a decommission process, which requires a plan for re-use
 - Bathrooms would need to be renovated
 - Would most likely be open during daylight hours to reduce need for lighting
 - Centrally-located
 - Potential connection along River walking trail for on-leash activities
 - McKinney Park could also be good location
 - Serve south side neighborhoods
 - Important to establish site selection criteria and matrix for justification of location decision



Q1 How important are parks, recreation, and open space to the quality of life in Corning?











It needs to have flowers, bird baths, fountains, butterfly gardens. There is so much potential here to be something really beautiful. Some lighting would be nice for evening strolls. o Mowing – looks a bit overgrown – not neat and tidy – not inviting. o Parking – street parking only o Bathrooms – no facilities, a porta-potty would be nice. o Pavement Benches/Seating – limited benches – needs to be updated. o Paths/Paved Walkways – cinder pathways Civic Center Plaza o General Appearance – it looks abandoned and cold. It wouldn't take much to have colorful umbrellas over tables and flowers pots. o Mowing – N/A but the landscaping is lacking and could really use some beautiful flowers to fill the plaza. o Equipment – lacking in some charming seating areas. o Pavilions – N/A but some covered seating would be nice – the courtyard does get warm. o Parking – the parking can be difficult at the library and city offices. Not very friendly with small children. o Bathrooms – a must in this area. If the library isn't open there is no option available. o Pavement/Brickwork – this could use some attention to prevent tripping o Benches/Seating – more could be provided to encourage people to use the area - more family friendly. I have a ton of ideas for this area to make it useable for children and adults. Denison o General Appearance – There are times when the park looks well maintain and other times it is a mess – with overgrown grass, downed trees and branches, no flowers, dirty pavilions, scum filled pond. o Mowing – the grass is often left to become overgrown and when moved heavy grass is left all over the fields and open areas. o Equipment – the equipment is very outdated and in disrepair. Many of the pieces have items missing, dirty, and broken. The play areas are weed filled. The mats for the some of the toys are not in their intended place. The little ring road for biking needs repair to asphalt. The swing for special needs is wonderful but more adult sized swings could be used to accommodate larger individuals. A shared parent/child swing would be wonderful! o Pavilions – the newer pavilion is nice – a light would be nice for evening use. That side of the park gets dark fast with the dike and roadway blocking the evening sun. The older pavilion could also use a light. This pavilion could use a weekly power wash to stay tidy. o Bathrooms – the bathrooms are clean. The	8/29/2019 1:22 PM

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biggest issue is that they need to be open longer or even all year long. We frequent the park all year and having a bathroom especially for children is a must. Additional water fountains around the park would be nice. o Out Buildings – covered with graffiti – has been left there for a couple of years. The buildings are underutilized. It would be great to offer some snacks or beverages at certain times in the summer. o Pavement/Parking – additional parking could really be used. People often have to park in the grass which leads to big holes. The drainage by the bathrooms after a hard rain needs to be addressed. There is often standing water there and then it makes at least 6 parking spaces unusable. The new pavement throughout the park has been a very nice and much needed addition. I hope that plans to do the last stretch on the backside of the pond are in the plans. o Benches/Seating – around the playground area there could be additional and what is currently there is not in good shape. Picnic benches are old and dirty. o Paths/Paved Walkways o Athletic Fields – seemed to be tended well, although mowing is inconsistent excess grass is an issue – long rows of grass are often the norm. o Ponds – the ponds are filled with green algae, downed trees, and weeds are starting to overtake the pond area. The Gazebo is nice. There could be additional seating around the pond for fishing. o Pool – nice new chairs this year. Have not been in the dressing areas recently. It would be nice if the pool season was longer. o Skate Park – doesn't seem sufficient in its design. o Tunnels – graffiti at times o Trees – I was in the park when a massive branch broke off of a tree only 150 yards from our family. The branch just missed a vehicle and completely covered the roadway. I called 911 and reported the incident. A city crew came about 15 minutes later. Many of the trees seem to be in bad condition. Over the past two years several willow trees have fallen into the pond. Many branches still remain in the pond and are an eyesore. Even when trees have been cut down they have been left for weeks before being cleaned up. Those in the pond are going on a couple of years. o Tennis Courts/ Basketball Courts – they are in decent condition and are frequently used. o Workout Stations – a very nice addition to the park. I see that they are used quite often when I pass through. o Volley Ball – sand could be filled in and cleaned. o Horseshoe Area – adequate for the amount of use it gets. o Frisbee Golf – nice set up for this. I feel bad for those who are golfing when the grass is not mowed properly – wet and messy. Hillvue o General Appearance – there are parts that are nicely kept and other not so much. We like to use this park in the spring before the weeds have taken over the play area. o Mowing – nice by the lookout but the others areas are inconsistent in the timely mowing allowing grass to get too long. The weeds in the play area are bad. I have noticed a neighborhood lady taking the time to weed the playground area. o Equipment – the equipment is not bad but could use a good power wash every season. o Pavilions – the area is clean. Picnic table could use a regular cleaning. Plants growing on the roof. Look-out pavilion is kept nice. o Parking – street parking only. Amount of parking is not an issue. o Bathrooms – they are locked and never open. This is not acceptable with small children using the area and families picnicking. Water fountain not working. What do you do when you have small children? I have had to keep a small potty in our car just because parks don't have facilities for them to use. I hate to say it but we have had to go behind a tree because it was an emergency situation. o Out Buildings – need repair. Bathrooms out of order. o Benches/Seating - adequate o Paths/Paved Walkways - I am not sure if the bike path is part of the park. This is nice but the grass isn't mowed all the way to the ends. If you bike through the area you get weed whipped by the long grass. I am an avid biker and would love to see the path extended all the way down the dike to Denison Park. That would be such a nice ride for families. Williams Street Park and Denison could be the anchors for this. It would be a nice selling point for the city to encourage people to come and bike the path and visit the downtown. Houghton o General Appearance – this park has the nicest/most updated equipment of all the parks. I am passionate about this topic and come from a perspective of an adult citizen and as a parent. As you consider developing a strategy, I would ask you to think forward and use people's experiences as a foundation but move towards the newest technology and even take some risk in predicting what the community needs in the future, not what they need today. While thinking of the community needs, I also ask that city deliver to the needs of the whole community, which is difficult due to the bimodal wealth distribution of the community. Corning is a small town far from metropolitan areas, but is in the middle of a huge population that is a drivable distance away. With cities like Pittsburgh, Cleavland, Toronto, Buffalo, Syracuse, Boston, New York, Philadelphia and Washington DC within a 7 hour drive Corning could become a meeting place for highly competitive athletic matches. It is my opinion that the success of the Wine Glass marathon is not due to the organization that put it on, though their effort should not be disregarded, it is due to the ability to draw people for a quick weekend trip from many places. As an active parent in the AAU basketball circuit, ultra high competiition matches could be easily organized to draw teams from the previously marked metros. Corning could be the place for the big teams to meet. Similar arguements could be made for swimming, lacrosse, hockey, soccer, wrestling, baseball/softball, track and field and artistic performances. The Arts At Canfield The geographic slope at Canfield park makes the park almost unusable as a place for recreational play - but is ideally setup for an amphitheater. I would like the community to support the development of a place where people can come together around a stage that compliments the smaller stage setting on Market Street. The park could be a simple structure with a covered stage with open seating or a three season covered arena protecting audiences from the elements. Modern facilities with water and electricity is a necessity along with points of sale for concessions including alcoholic beverages. The sales (either contracted or run by the city itself) could support some of the costs of maintaining the facility. Fields At Stewart There is a need for field space for lacrosse and soccer. Local club teams within the community currently use Stewart along with other parks. I would dedicate a park specifically for field space and provide modern facilities (bathrooms, concession stands). Collaboration With the CPP The city stadium has been essentially been given to CPP, however CPP has failed to deliver on promises that have been made to the community. With promises to open their facilities to the community during the upgrades, the community has not been provided access. The community has also been restricted from using the track in their own stadium for recreational running. Better agreements should be made to share facilities including CPP tennis courts, volleyball, baseball fields, gym space and indoor track for the use of the stadium and future facilities. The Facility At Dennision The most ambitious and needed facility for Corning is the indoor facility. I think the best location would be where the swimming pool and fields are at Denison Park today. I would strongly encourage the city to go big to create an athletic tuorism destintation for Corning. To start, an olympic size pool and diving center would be unique enough to bring in the best talent from the cities. The pool facility could also be shared by CPP. On the side of of the diving center on the lower floor could be two sheets of ice for hockey tournaments and recreational curling teams.	4/6/2019 11:18 AM

In addition to the traditional park facility, a digital space with large screens for competitive PvP video gaming. On the top floor four full gyms could be made in two areas. 

Q20 What is your age?






