### **Education**

#### K-12

The City of Corning is served by the Corning-Painted Post Area School District. The District has a total enrollment of 4,800 students and provides the International Bacheloriare Program. The community is also served by private schools including the Alternative School for Math and Science, All Saints Academy, and Corning Christian Academy. The region is also home to the Greater Southern Tier STEM Academy which is a Pathways in Technology Early College High School (P-TECH). According to the U.S Census, 93.4% of the City's population have at least a High School degree.

#### Higher Education

According to the 2018 American Community Survey 5 Year Estimates, 46.5% of the City's population has an Associate's degree or higher. In the immediate area, Corning is served by Corning Community College with a total enrollment of 4,000 students. Within a 50-mile radius there are several other colleges and universities including:
