



## **Waste Water Treatment Plant**

The City's Waste Water Treatment Plant (WWTP) was originally constructed in 1969. It is located adjacent to Denison Park. The facility is "permitted" by the New York State Department of Conservation to treat and discharge up to 3.08 million gallons per day.

The WWTP uses a biological treatment process instead of chemical to treat sewage waste while meeting or exceeding New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) standards. The plant's process involves intake, grit removal, primary settling, secondary biological treatment, secondary settling, chemical treatment for removal of phosphorus, post-aeration, anaerobic digestion, and sludge dewatering.
